Allowances 24.1 MEAL ALLOWANCE

a) A full-time or part-time employee required to work overtime for more than two hours without being notified on the previous day or earlier that the employee will be so required to work will be supplied with a meal by the employer or paid a meal allowance of \$13.38.

b) If an employee pursuant to notice has provided a meal and is not required to work overtime or is required to work less than the amount advised, he or she shall be paid as prescribed above for the meal which he or she has provided but which is surplus

24.3 CLOTHING, EQUIPMENT AND TOOLS

24.3 a): Where a Cook is required to use his or her own tools, the employer must pay an allowance of \$1.73 per day or part there off up to a maximum of \$8.49 per week.

24.3 b): The employer and employee may agree upon an arrangement under which the employee will wash and iron the speacial clothing for an agreed sum of money. For purposes of this clause black and white attire (not being a dinner suit or evenning dress), shoes, hose and or socks are not special clothing.
